Accommodation

NMIT has three main providers of accommodation. Each offer a different living experience, level of service and price point.

- > **Nikau Apartments** (pictured) is located on our Nelson campus. Your own large room with a double bed, studio apartment or shared living area with two, three or four others. www.nikauapartments.co.nz
- > **The Bush Inn** is a more affordable option, just 15 minutes walk from campus with single rooms and communal living. Some cleaning of shared facilities is provided. www.thebushinn.co.nz
- > **Homestay** (organised through NMIT) live with a local family. Catered and non-catered options are available. www.nmit.ac.nz/accommodation

Note: We advise applying for accommodation as soon as possible, even before your study abroad application is submitted, to avoid missing out.

Key dates 2019

Semester 1

- > **Semester one start** 25 February
- > Semester one mid term break 13 - 28 April
- > **Semester one exams end** 5 July

Semester 2

- > **Semester two start** 22 July
- > Semester two mid term break 28 September - 13 October
- > **Semester two exams end** 29 November

Make sure your flights arrive before the start of the semester and your return flights are after the semester ends.

Entry requirements

For students coming to NMIT from our partner institutes: In general, if you have your home institute's approval to study at NMIT we will likely approve you to study with us. For all other students we expect you to have above average grades at your home institute. In addition, English requirements must be met, this is generally an academic IELTS of 6.0 (no band below 5.5) or a TOEFL iBT of 60 (writing score of 20), or approved equivalent – see our website for more details.

Study Abroad tuition fees

Study Abroad subjects

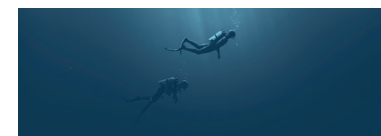
NMIT offers Bachelor's Degree level studies to Study Abroad students in the following majors. Most courses are worth 15 credits, and you must study at least three courses. Four courses is an average workload, that is 60 NMIT credits (30 ECTS / 15 US Semester Credits).



Art, Design and Media

Nelson is a national hub of art, design and media with more than 300 working artists in the city.

Marine Science

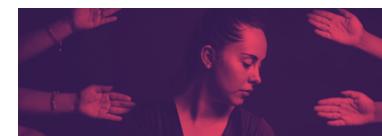

- > Accounting

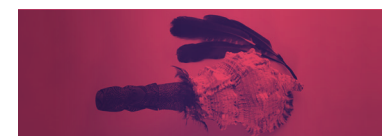

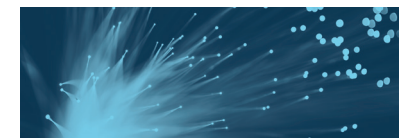
Electives
